These are the European data of the garbage produced on average by a single person in one year and the total amount of garbage produced in the year 2019.

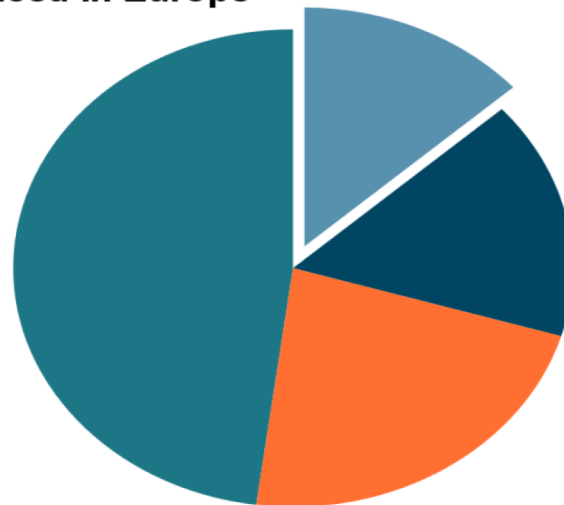
Below are the quantities of garbage produced annually in Italy (per person and in total):
